## TRIANGLE REGIONAL **TRANSIT SURVEY 2023**

Chapel Hill Transit coordinated with other transit agencies in the Triangle to participate in a survey in Fall 2023 to collect data on demographics and trip characteristics for bus riders throughout Wake, Orange, and Durham Counties.

The survey results will help Chapel Hill Transit and other agencies identify needs and plan for improvements in regional transit service delivery. Survey results will inform local transit plans, development of future rail and bus rapid transit corridors, and regional travel demand modeling and multimodal transportation plans.






## Most riders are employed and/or students
