61 Chair Nish Trivedi called the meeting to order at 1:30 p.m.

62 **PRELIMINARIES:**

63 **2. Roll Call**

64 The roll call was completed using a sign-in sheet for in-person attendees, and the Zoom participant
65 list for remote attendees.

66 **3. Adjustments to the Agenda**

67 Chair Nish Trivedi asked the Technical Committee (TC) if there were any adjustments to the
68 agenda. Tom Devlin stated regarding Item 8 for Amendment #2 in the March 12, 2024, Minutes. He
69 asked if Amendment #4 was going live instead of Amendment #3.

70 **4. Public Comments**

71 Chair Nish Trivedi asked if there were any public comments. Joe Milazzo, the Director of the
72 Regional Transportation Alliance (RTA) mentioned that RTA is going on a tour to Richmond, Virginia. to
73 visit a nearby peer city for quick, intentional field visit of a freeway cap, bus rapid transit (BRT) facilities,
74 and other multimodal infrastructure. Joe Milazzo stated that RTA is supporting the US 70 East Corridor
75 Study project and is requesting that a junior freeway design be considered along the existing alignment

76 between I-885 and I-540 or at least to the county line. Mr. Milazzo expressed his support for other
77 projects.

6. DCHC MPO Wildlife Crossing Planning Study
David Miller, MPO Staff

David Miller introduced co-presenters Ron Sutherland and Ramona McGee. Ron Sutherland
along with his colleague Nikki Robinson provided a background on roadway ecology and wildlife crossings
and shared some of the progressive work conducted by Wildlands Network. Ron Sutherland explained
habitat connectivity and its theme of modern conservation biology in which organisms can move freely
across the landscape, described the use of wildlife crossings for the safe movement of wildlife species to
cross highways, and provided several visuals of road ecology.

Ramona McGee shared a background of the wildlife connectivity work conducted by the Triangle
Connectivity Collaborative Transportation Workgroup.

David Miller shared statistics from NCDOT's 2020 to 2022 animal-vehicle crash data, comparing
the MPO's area to statewide trends. David Miller provided an overview of the MPO's wildlife crossing
planning process, including the development of a core technical team consisting of MPO members and
partner agencies, site identification and assessments, anticipated timeline, and public engagement
activities. Vice Chair Ellen Beckmann asked if other MPOs in North Carolina have developed a wildlife

107 crossings plan, and if so, have they been helpful to make an impact to wildlife crossing sites. David Miller
108 replied that the Land of Sky RPO and French Broad MPO completed a plan in 2022, and Nikki Robinson
109 shared wildlife crossing projects in their planning area. Brandon Jones stated NCDOT is supportive of
110 wildlife crossing countermeasures.

112 **7. US 70 East Corridor Study Phase 1 Report**

117 David Miller gave a brief background of the US 70 East Corridor Study, which included the timeline
118 of the planning process, key stakeholder engagement, and a recap of the second round of public
119 engagement. Anne Lenart-Redmond provided an overview of the two local alternative concepts, which
120 were the 4-lane boulevard, and 4-lane boulevard with parallel roads.

121 Andy Henry shared details of the study's next steps and Phase 2. Mr. Henry introduced the Express
122 Design Traffic Evaluation (EDTE) process, which will analyze the concepts developed by both NCDOT
123 and the MPO. Andy Henry shared that Phase 2 will include additional public engagement efforts. Andy

124 Henry provided an overview of the potential development timeline for both the NCDOT and MPO

127 **8. US 70 West Multimodal Corridor Study**

131 Chair Nishith Trivedi gave the background on the two-year planning process and gave updates on
132 the progress of the US 70 West Multimodal Corridor Study. He stated that the study revealed traffic
133 patterns on US 70 Business has changed. Chair Nish Trivedi said vehicles are speeding and accidents
134 are increasing. Chair Nish Trivedi discussed the goals of the Study and policy improvements. One of the
135 policy improvements cited was to extend sidewalk connectivity. Chair Nish Trivedi introduced a
136 recommendation to reduce speed in some areas to decrease accidents.

137 The TC asked how speed limits would be lowered when design speeds would be increased
138 throughout the project. Chair Nish Trivedi replied that when the study was done it included short-, long-
139 and medium-term improvements, and lowering the speed was on the short-term list.

140 Tom Devlin made a motion to adopt the US 70 West Multimodal Study. The motion was seconded
141 by Aaron Cain. The motion passed unanimously.

143 **9. FY 2025-2029 Coordinated Public Transit-Human Services**

144 **Transportation Plan**

147 Kelly Richard gave an overview of the Coordinated Public Transit Human Services Plan. Kelly
148 Richard explained how the traditional and non-traditional projects would be funded through the Enhanced
149 Mobility of Seniors & Individuals with Disabilities Section 5310 Funds, and that fifty-five percent of these
150 funds must be allocated to the traditional projects. Kelly Richard presented the timeline and next steps for
151 the plan.

152 Vice Chair Ellen Beckmann made a motion to receive the draft plan and recommended the Board
153 receive the draft plan and release it for a 21-day public comment period. Carolyn Dwyer seconded the
154 motion. The motion passed unanimously.

161 Colleen McGue gave an overview of the Destination 2055: Revised MTP Plan. Colleen introduced
162 Monet Moore to discuss the recommendations.

163 Monet Moore presented a summary of the changes to the 2050 goals and objectives that would better
164 reflect the desires of the communities and respondents for the plan. Ms. Moore explained the justification for
165 each of the revisions. There was much discussion on the item and the board decided to have the plan word
166 smithed and returned to the June TC Meeting for approval.

168 **11. Amendment #3 to the FY2024-2033 Transportation Improvement Program**

171 Filmon Fishastion presented the Amendment schedule to the board and mentioned the items
172 included in the amendments and their status. Mr. Fishastion listed additional changes which were getting
173 rid of duplicate current STIPs. He also listed the recently added projects.

174 Tom Devlin expressed his concerns about the release date of the 4th amendment being pushed to
175 September. Doug Plachcinski questioned if Durham had any amendments planned. Tom Devlin replied
176 yes. Colleen McGue suggested doing a Call for Amendments in June, publishing the schedule, and
177 sending it to everyone.

178 Caroline Dwyer made a motion to release Amendment #3 for public comment. The motion was
179 seconded by Paul Black. The motion passed unanimously.
