50 Chair Ellen Beckmann called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

51 **PRELIMINARIES:**

52 **1. Roll Call**

53 The roll call was completed using a sign-in sheet for in-person attendees, and the Zoom
54 participant list for remote attendees.

55 **2. Adjustments to the Agenda**

56 There were no adjustments to the agenda.

70 Tom Devlin made a motion to approve the consent agenda. Matt Day seconded the
71 motion. The motion passed unanimously.

72 **ACTION ITEMS:**

73 **8. FY2024-2033 Draft STIP Swap**
74 **Kelly Fomenko, LPA Staff**

75 Kelly Fomenko stated that the MPO’s recommendation is to swap in U-6120: NC 98, and
 76 to swap out U-6021: Fayetteville, though recently received guidance from NCDOT presented
 77 the opportunity to use the remaining funds for additional swaps, such as U-6118: NC 55. Kelly
 78 Fomenko stated that the TC must approve the swaps at its January meeting to meet established
 79 deadlines.

80 Brandon Jones said NCDOT recommends additional swaps at the state level: swap out
 81 U-5720B: US 70 (Miami Boulevard) Upgrades, and swap in two State rail projects in Wake
 82 County (P-5734: Trinity and P-5736: Beryl), and U-5774F: NC 54 Upgrades - Grade
 83 Separations at Falconbridge, Farrington, and I-40. Bergen Watterson said Chapel Hill is
 84 considering swapping out U-5774B: NC 54 Improvements - Fordham to Barbee Chapel. Chair
 85 Ellen Beckmann recommended to defer a vote until January, and requested local staff provide
 86 information to the MPO for the January agenda.

87 **9. FY2024 Draft Unified Planning Work Program**
 88 **David Miller, LPA Staff**

89 David Miller stated that due to ongoing discussions with member jurisdictions about
 90 FY24 UPWP submissions, an amendment to the FY24 UPWP development schedule was
 91 recommended. David Miller said that the amended schedule would delay the draft FY24 UPWP
 92 presentation until the January 25, 2023 TC meeting.

93 Vice Chair Nishith Trivedi made a motion to recommend that the MPO Board approve
 94 the FY24 UPWP development schedule amendment. Margaret Hauth seconded the motion.
 95 The motion passed unanimously.

96 **8. Targets for Safety Performance Measures**
 97 **Andy Henry, LPA Staff**

98 Andy Henry shared the targets for safety performance measures from 2018 to 2022, the
 99 proposed safety targets for 2023, and stated that adopting the safety targets are required by
 100 federal legislation. Andy Henry said that the MPO has the option to establish its own safety

101 targets or adopt the safety targets developed by NCDOT, and added that the MPO has
 102 supported the safety targets NCDOT has developed.

103 Tom Devlin made a motion to recommend that the DCHC MPO Board adopt the
 104 resolution that supports the state's safety targets. Vice Chair Nishith Trivedi seconded the
 105 motion. The motion passed unanimously.

106 **11. DCHC MPO Technical Committee Officer Election**
 107 **Doug Plachcinski, AICP, CFM, DCHC MPO Executive Director**

108 Doug Plachcinski stated that the MPO has received TC Officer nominations for Nishith
 109 Trivedi as Chair, and Ellen Beckmann as Vice Chair. Doug Plachcinski stated that additional
 110 nominations are due by January 11, 2023, and the election will occur at the January 25 TC
 111 meeting.

112 **REPORTS FROM STAFF:**

113 **12. Report from Staff**
 114 **Doug Plachcinski, Executive Director, DCHC MPO**

115 Doug Plachcinski had no information to add to his written report. Dale McKeel shared
 116 that Triangle J Council of Governments (TJCOG) has released its request for proposals for the
 117 Triangle Transportation Choices transportation demand management (TDM) grant program.

118 **13. Report from the Technical Committee Chair**
 119 **Ellen Beckmann, TC Chair**

120 Chair Ellen Beckmann stated that the Durham Transit Plan process is near completion.

121 **14. NCDOT Reports**
 122 **Brandon Jones (David Keilson), Division 5 – NCDOT**

123 Brandon Jones had no additional report.

124 **Wright Archer (Pat Wilson, Stephen Robinson), Division 7 – NCDOT**

125 Stephen Robinson said that the New Hope Church Road Bridge Replacement project is
 126 slated to be completed by January, and added that the I-40 widening project requires additional
 127 modifications that are being addressed.

128 **Patrick Norman (Bryan Kluchar), Division 8 - NCDOT**

129 Bryan Kluchar had no additional report.

130 **Julie Bogle, Transportation Planning Division – NCDOT**

131 Scott Walston said that NCDOT's consultants have finished the draft Freight Plan, which
132 is expected to be released for review soon. Scott Walston said that outreach pertaining to the
133 electric vehicle component of the NC Clean Transportation Plan is expected. Scott Walston
134 shared that a presentation for the Carbon Reduction Plan is available to MPOs.

135 **John Grant, Traffic Operations – NCDOT**

136 There was no additional report.

137 **Nick Morrison, Integrated Mobility Division – NCDOT**

138 Nick Morrison shared that applications for the Safe Routes to School program and the
139 Paved Trails and Sidewalk Feasibility Grant program are being accepted and includes 100%
140 program funding.
