9. <u>FY2024-2033 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Updates (5</u> <u>Minutes</u>)

Amendment #5 to the FY2024-33 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) continues to modify and add projects from the recent Call for Projects. This amendment also incorporates recently awarded funds such as the Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE) grant and 5310 funds into both existing and new projects.

As there are projects with changes in excess of \$2 million and 25% from the original amount, per the MPO's Public Involvement Plan (PIP), this amendment will be released for a 21-day public comment period. The current timeline for adoption is as follows:

- November 5: TC recommended Board release for public comment
- November 19: Board released for public comment
- January 14: TC recommended Board approve the amendment
- January 28: Board approves the amendment

Additionally, the call for amendments for TIP Amendment #6 was open through January 21, 2025. Details regarding the process for submitting an amendment are attached.

10. <u>2024 Update to Program Management Plan (PMP) for the Section 5310</u> <u>Grant: Enhanced Mobility for Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities</u> (5 Minutes)

Every 2 years, the MPO selects and funds transportation projects that improve mobility for seniors and people with disabilities through the Federal Transit Administration's (FTA) Section 5310 Grant. The Program Management Plan, or PMP, creates the rules for how the MPO will select, fund and implement these projects. The PMP is being updated with references to recently updated 2024 Coordinated Public Transit - Human Services Transportation Plan (the Coordinated Plan). Additional edits include clarification around the relationship between the City of Durham, the Direct Recipient of Section 5310 funding in the Durham UZA, and the DCHC MPO which manages the implementation of the Coordinated Plan and selection of 5310 Program of Projects, as well as the addition of a Checklist for Project Manager Review of Uniform Guidance Audit Findings as requested by the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) during recent discussions with the City of Durham. The 2024 Update to the PMP is included as an attachment. The Draft PMP was posted on the MPO website, on social media, and emailed to stakeholders from the Coordinated Plan update for their review. No public comments were received.

- October 8, 2024: TC recommended MPO Board release the 2024 Draft Update to the PMP for 21-day public comment period.
- October 22, 2024: MPO Board released the 2024 Draft Update to the PMP for 21 -day public comment period.
- November/December 2024: MPO staff finalizes the Draft 2024 PMP, including recommendations received during public comment period.
- January 2025: TC reviewed the 2024 Update to the PMP and recommended MPO Board adoption.
- · January 2025: MPO Board adopts the 2024 Update to the PMP.

11. <u>Targets for Safety Performance Measures (15 minutes)</u> David Miller, MPO Staff Brian Murphy, NCDOT Traffic Safety Unit

Per federal statute, MPOs must adopt targets for safety performance measures. MPOs may either agree to support the targets developed by the state (NCDOT), or they may develop and adopt their own. The MPO must adopt the targets for safety performance measures by February 27, 2025.

Brian Murphy, Traffic Safety Systems Engineer from NCDOT's Traffic Safety Unit, will present an overview of NCDOT's safety performance measures and targets, and share safety data specific to the DCHC MPO planning area. This presentation will be provided as information for discussion before it is brought back to the Technical Committee and Board in February for action before the February 27 deadline.

As part of its safety planning work, DCHC MPO is developing a regional Safety Action Plan in partnership with MPO members, NCDOT and other stakeholders. A product of the Safety Action Plan will be data that could support MPO-developed safety targets. The MPO has supported NCDOT's safety targets in the past, but the Safety Action Plan will offer an opportunity for the MPO to develop its own safety targets if MPO staff are directed to do so. The plan is expected to be completed in late Spring 2025, and the data could be used for MPO-developed safety target setting in 2026.

A presentation, a sample resolution supporting NCDOT's 2025 safety targets, and an MPO safety target setting matrix developed by the MPO's Safety Action Plan consultant team (Toole Design and VHB) are included as attachments.

An updated plan for public outreach and engagement will be shared with the Technical Committee and Board prior to conducting the outreach and engagement for the proposed alternatives.

This is an annual reminder for all MPO Board members and alternates that the annual State Ethics Commission filing period for members started on January 1st. All Board members and alternates need to file new Statements of Economic Interest (SEIs) and Real Estate Disclosure (RED) forms. The annual filing period runs from January 1st through April 15th.

Beth Seidel, our new Clerk to the Board, is the new MPO Ethics Liaison. If you have any questions regarding filing with the State Ethics Commission, please reach out to Beth. An informational sheet from the State Ethics Commission is attached, which explains the obligations for all MPO Board members and alternates, along with tips for filing electronically. There is a statutory Grace Period which commences with the 30 Day Notice letter; failure to file in that 30 day window can result in fines being levied. Fines total \$500, and failure to file is a misdemeanor.
