90	Alpesh Patel presented the results from the 2023 Triangle Regional Transit Survey to	
91	the MPO Technical Committee. He stated this study is an Origin-Destination (OD) survey which	
92	does not collect data about customer satisfaction but is more focused on trip purpose and more	
93	focused on what happens when a person leaves their home to their bus stop and what occurs in	
94	between. He stated the survey is typically conducted every five years and this survey was	
95	conducted last year as a 1st cross-regional tablet-based survey with several participating	
96	agencies. Alpesh gave the outcomes of the surveys and shared the interactive dashboard,	
97	which is available online.

8. FY2025 Call for Projects Recommendation & Release for Public Comment

Colleen McGue, MPO Staff Filmon Fishastion, MPO Staff

Colleen McGue introduced the FY2025 Call for Projects and Fillmon Fishastion presented the 3 scenarios. Mr. Fishastion noted the changes to the call for projects minimum project costs have changed from \$100,000 to \$250,000, among other recent changes to the federal funding policy. Doug Plachcinski suggested for the next call for projects the MPO creates an environment where project sponsors come together with initial project scores and review them as a group before they are presented to this body because a lot of the applications were incomplete or did not have accompanying updated information.

Paul Black made a motion to release scenario one as the proposed projects to be funded through the FY2025 Calls for Project for a 21-day public comment period. Ellen Beckmann seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

9. <u>FY2025 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) Approval</u> Doug Plachcinski, AICP, CFM, DCHC MPO Executive Director

Doug Plachcinski gave an update on the UPWP. Tom Devlin requested a breakout of the membership dues and asked what options exist for members not able to pay their dues due to budget constraints. Mr. Plachcinski replied that the budget and scope of work would have to be reduced, Mr. Plachcinski explained the significant increases in the dues.

Eric Vitale asked if there was any plan to update the MPO bylaws. Doug Plachcinski said there is a discussion happening to update the bylaws.

Ellen Beckmann made a motion to approve the FY2025 UPWP with the addition to add the membership dues. Matt Efird seconded the motion. The motion passed with four in opposition: Tom Devlin, Eric Vitale, Erin Convery, and Jeff Lecky.
