7. <u>US 15-501 Corridor Study (20 minutes)</u> Andy Henry, LPA staff

The DCHC MPO Board released the final report of the US 15-501 Corridor Study for public comment at the September Board meeting and conducted a public hearing at the October meeting. The Chair directed staff to present a response at the November meeting to the major comments received from the public and Board members. The US 15-501 Project Steering Committee met and assembled the attached response for the Board.

The purpose of the US 15-501 Corridor Study is to identify projects for inclusion in the MPO's long-range plans, i.e., MTP (Metropolitan Transportation Plan) and CTP (Comprehensive Transportation Plan), and prioritization process for the TIP (Transportation Improvement Program).

8. <u>Triangle Region ITS Strategic Deployment Plan Update (10 minutes)</u> Felix Nwoko, LPA Staff Casey Chae, LPA Staff

The Triangle Regional ITS Deployment Plan was updated by a consultant team led by VHB, and joined by Iteris and ICF. The updated Triangle Regional ITS Deployment Plan reflects the current status of ITS deployments in the region and to identifies recommended deployments over the next 10 years. The recommendations in the plan are intended to guide the continued implementation of strategies and technologies to improve safety and reliability of the regional transportation system. The update was prepared with the assistance and guidance of both CAMPO and the DCHC MPO and involved extensive participation by NCDOT and all local municipalities, transit agencies, and emergency service providers in the Triangle Region. 9. <u>State of the Region Report (10 minutes)</u> Felix Nwoko, LPA staff

The DCHC MPO has recently completed the 2019 State of the Region report, a synopsis of demographic and economic trends affecting travel behavior and transportation system performance in the DCHC region. The report is organized into five chapters addressing demographics, the regional economy, regional structure and commuter flows, mobility metrics, and safety. The report sheds light on how the transportation system supports DCHC's goals of providing great quality of life, economic viability, and promoting environmental sustainability through transportation investments by providing a data-focused evaluation of the issues that affect - and are affected by - transportation.

On October 14, 2020, the DCHC MPO Board released the 2019 State of the Regional report for a 21-day public comment period. To date, no public comments have been received.

10. <u>TIP Amendment #3 (10 minutes)</u> Anne Phillips, LPA Staff

Amendment #3 to the FY2020-2029 TIP consists of projects that have been amended in the STIP by NCDOT and projects that were affected by NCDOT's STIP reprogramming exercise. For a list of projects that were affected by the STIP reprogramming, see the STIP Reprogramming List attachment. Projects amended by NCDOT in the STIP need to be amended in the MPO's TIP so that the TIP and STIP remain in concurrence.

DCHC MPO is also amending several locally administered projects to reflect more realistic project delivery schedules. For a full list of locally administered projects, see page two of the attached Full Report.

In accordance with conversations with NCDOT, three locally administered projects are being delayed to allow U-5823 Woodcroft Parkway Extension, which had a construction delay until FY 31 in the STIP reprogramming exercise, to move into construction into FY 23. These projects are:

- · EB-5837 Third Fork Creek Trail
- · EB-5834 Guess Road Sidewalks
- EB-5835 NC 55 Sidewalks

MPO and City of Durham staff are proposing schedule delays for these three projects instead of a delay of more than ten years to the Woodcroft Parkway Extension - so that the City of Durham does not lose design work that has already been completed on the Woodcroft Parkway Extension. The City of Durham is paying for the design of the Woodcroft Parkway Extension with local funds.

The Guess Road and NC 55 sidewalk projects are underfunded in the TIP, both with federal funds and the local match. These projects therefore would not have been able to move forward according to their schedule prior to this amendment. Although, construction of the Third Ford Creek Trail is being delayed by four years in the TIP, the project will essentially only experience a two-year delay based on its current status.

Although changes to the locally administered projects do not meet the MPO Public Involvements Policy's definition of a substantial amendment ("addition or deletion of a project with an implementation cost exceeding \$1 million"), the MPO Board may vote to hold a 21-day public comment period for this amendment.

11. <u>Comprehensive Transportation Plan (CTP) Amendment #2 (10</u> <u>minutes)</u>

Andy Henry, LPA Staff

The Technical Committee (TC) recommends that the DCHC MPO Board delete the Briggs Avenue Extension from the Comprehensive Transportation Plan (CTP). The cost to construct this roadway will be prohibitively high given that a bridge over the CSX rail line will be required. Also, the original intent of the roadway was to connect an existing and future industrial area, however, the future industrial area has developed into a residential neighborhood. An attachment provides additional information and a map.

The schedule includes:

- November 11 -- MPO Board releases CTP Amendment #2 for a 30-day public comment period
- December 3 Public comment period ends
- December 9 DCHC MPO Board conducts public hearing and adopts amendment #2

It should be noted that based on the new provision NCGS 166A-19.24(e), the Durham City Attorney has advised the DCHC MPO that the Board can hold a public hearing and vote on the matter on the same day but must continue to receive public comments for at least 24 hours.

The Triangle Bikeway project will study the idea of a 17-mile bicycle path. The bikeway will link Raleigh, Research Triangle Park (RTP), Durham and Chapel Hill along I-40 and NC 54. The current planning effort includes design and construction recommendations between Raleigh and RTP, and a corridor assessment for the connection west to Durham and Chapel Hill. The bikeway will connect Triangle communities making both short and long bike trips for work, play and daily errands possible. Ideas from residents will shape the plan. Agencies across the region are working together in the planning process, which will take approximately 18 months.

14. Move Durham (20 minutes) Ellen Beckmann, City of Durham

On October 5, 2020, the Durham City Council adopted the Move Durham study, a visioning document for transportation improvements in Central Durham. This study establishes a multi-modal transportation vision to maintain and promote a safe, reliable, convenient, connected, and equitable transportation network. It was funded through a combination of STBGDA funds provided through the DCHC MPO, State Planning funds, and City matching funds. Many of the recommendations of the report are requested to be considered in future MPO adoptions of the CTP, MTP, TIP, and Durham County Transit Plan. Ellen Beckmann, Planning Manager for the City of Durham Transportation Department, will present the findings and recommendations from the study.
