7. NC 98 Corridor Study (10 minutes)

The MPO Board released the draft report of the NC 98 Corridor Study for a minimum 30-day public comment period at their August meeting and conducted a public hearing at their September meeting. Based on comments from the public and the Durham Board of County Commissioners (BOCC), there is one substantive change to the report that was released in August. The Durham County segment of NC 98 will include two options. One option is the original recommendation to have bike lanes and sidewalks. An additional option is a multiuse path on each side of the roadway instead of the bike lanes and sidewalks. Additional text briefly explains the difference in expected local funding impacts between the two options based on the state policy for bicycle and pedestrian facilities.

The approved report will provide projects for inclusion in the MPO's multimodal long-range transportation plans and related local plans as they are updated. The final report is available from the WSP Web site: http://www.nc98corridor.com/library/. There are two attachments: a copy of the final public comments; and, a copy of the resolution that the Durham Board of County Commissioners approved -- the resolution addresses the need for the additional multiuse path option.

8. NC 54 West Corridor Study (30 minutes)

The NC 54 Corridor Study is an in-depth review of the 20+ mile stretch of NC 54 between Old Fayetteville Road in Carrboro and I-85 in Graham. This roadway currently supports about 6,000 to 15,000 vehicles per day, and is expected to see increases in the future due to residential growth in Alamance County and the major employment centers in the Chapel Hill/Carrboro area. DCHC MPO, along with its local government partners and BGMPO and TARPO have undertaken this study to develop opportunities and strategies to improve the roadway and support the communities alongside it.

The goal of this study is to develop a long-term vision for this corridor. This vision is comprehensive, as it addresses preservation of the area's character, economic opportunity and vitality, environmental sensitivity, and transportation improvements for all users (drivers, freight, pedestrians, bicyclists, etc.).

The draft study itself is completed, a copy of the study and supporting materials is available at www.nc54west.com/documents.asp. Once released by the Board, the NC 54 Corridor Study will have a 30-day public comment period beginning Monday, October 15, before it is brought to the MPO Board for public hearing and adoption in November.

9. <u>Triangle Regional Freight Plan (10 minutes)</u> Andy Henry, LPA Staff

The MPO Board released the Triangle Regional Freight Plan for a minimum 30-day public comment period at their September meeting. Today, the Board is to conduct a public hearing and provide comments to staff. Approval of the Freight Plan means that the MPO will consider including the Plan's recommendations in the MPO's long-range transportation plans and policies as they are updated. In addition, local governments might want to consider some of the recommendations for their plans, programs and policies.

At the September Board meeting, Board members posed several questions that staff was not able to address. In the interim, staff created the attached document that attempts to address those questions.

10. <u>2045 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) -- Amendment #1 (10 minutes)</u>

The MPO Board released Amendment #1 to the 2045 MTP at their September meeting. Today, the Board will conduct a public hearing on the amendment and provide feedback to staff. Amendment #1 corrects detailed project information to ensure that there are not any inconsistencies between the 2045 MTP and the FY2018-2027 State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP), and subsequently allow the Air Quality Conformity Determination process to proceed without interruption. These changes do not change the cross-section, costs, construction year or other important design considerations that would impact the project capacity, financial plan or Triangle Regional Model (TRM). The attached document shows the proposed changes in Amendment #1.

The proposed schedule for this amendment includes:

- * September -- Board release Amendment #1 for a minimum 30-day public comment period
 - * 10/10 -- Board conduct public hearing
 - * 10/16 -- public comment period ends
 - * 11/14 -- Board adopt Amendment #1

At this time, staff is having discussions with oversight agencies, such as the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), to possibly re-adopt the 2045 MTP in January 2019 to ensure that several Triangle Regional Model (TRM) corrections are assumed in the adopted Plan. Staff will update the MPO Board as the planned re-adoption process is developed. The process would likely include the release of the updated 2045 MTP in November 2018 and the re-adoption in January 2019. It is expected that the updated Plan would have very minor changes to model-related information such as performance measures. There would not be any changes to the substantive portions of the Plan such as project lists and the financial plan. In January 2019, the Board would re-adopt the 2045 MTP and the TRM, and adopt the Air Quality Conformity Determination Report (AQ CDR).

On April 28, 2017, the DCHC MPO Policy Board adopted the updated Orange County Transit Plan and the Durham County Transit Plan (the "Transit Plans") as well as the Interlocal Agreement for Cost-Sharing for the Durham-Orange Light Rail Transit (D-O LRT) Project. GoTriangle is presenting its quarterly report on the status of the D-O LRT Project as contemplated in the Transit Plans and the Interlocal Agreement.

12. <u>Allocation of Local Input Points for Division Needs Projects (10 minutes)</u>

On August 8, 2018, the DCHC MPO Board approved the release of the Initial Allocation of Local Input Points for Division Needs Projects for SPOT 5, based on the adopted Methodology. The public input process began on August 22, 2018; a public hearing hearing was held by the MPO Board on September 12, 2018. To date no public comment has been received.

A TC subcommittee met on August 22 and September 18 to develop recommendations for local input points for Division Needs projects. The recommendation of that subcommittee is attached. The only change to the subcommittee recommendation from the version that was brought to the Board at its September meeting is the removal of points from Finley Golf Course Road Bike/Ped and placement of points on the Northern Durham Parkway.

The deadline for submission of local allocation points for Division Needs projects has been delayed to November 29 due to effects from Hurricane Florence. Therefore, LPA staff is delaying the vote on the allocation until the November Board meeting. At that time, LPA staff will request the Board allow for changes to the allocation after adoption due to external factors, such as assignment of points from the Divisions and other MPOs and RPOs, with the consent of the Board Chair and Vice Chair (this was done for Regional Impact projects this summer).

Board Action: No action is necessary at this time. This item will be brought to the Board for a vote at its November 14, 2018 meeting.

13. Surface Transportation Block Grant -Direct Attributable (STBG-DA) and Transportation Alternative Program (TAP) Funding Distribution for FY2020 (5 minutes)

On October 14, 2015, the MPO Board approved the formula and policy to distribute STBG-DA and TAP funds to sub-recipients for fiscal years 2017 through 2025 with the expectation that each year, prior to development of the next year's Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP), the actual STBG-DA and TAP allocation to the DCHC MPO would be entered into the formula as would the most recent certified National Transit Database (NTD) data (to be used in calculating the distribution to transit agencies). Attached is a table with the FY20 STBG-DA and TAP funding available to the MPO and the allocation resulting from the formula. Approval of this allocation will commence the FY20 UPWP development as agencies may choose to use the allocation for planning purposes, and thus must program funds in the FY20 UPWP. The FY20 UPWP development schedule is also attached.

TC Action: Recommended the Board approve the FY20 distribution of STBG-DA and TAP funds.

14. Reprogramming of CMAQ Funds (15 minutes)

The Fixing American's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act, signed into law by President Obama in December 2015, dictates that any unobligated CMAQ or TAP-DA funds that are not obligated by September 30, 2019 be subject to rescission. LPA staff reviewed the current state of CMAQ and TAP-DA funds for DCHC projects and determined that several projects are not likely to be able to obligate CMAQ funds by the rescission deadline. Therefore, working with our local government partners, staff has developed a plan to reprogram CMAQ dollars to projects that can obligate the funds by September 30, 2019. The proposed reprogramming is shown in the attachment.

Projects that would have CMAQ funds reprogrammed to other projects will have future CMAQ funding set aside for them at a time that is more in line with their delivery schedule. Two projects would be cancelled as part of this reprogramming, but those projects would likely be cancelled regardless due to external factors.

LPA staff has determined that the outstanding TAP-DA funds will be obligated before September 30, 2019 for EB-4707A, Old Durham Road Bike/Ped, and EL-4828, Morgan Creek Greenway, and should therefore not be subject to federal rescission.

15. <u>Programming of FY2018-19 Regional Bicycle and Pedestrian Funds</u> (15 minutes)

Per MPO policy, and the adopted FY18 and FY19 UPWPs, the full amount of the MPO's TAP-DA funds are combined with a portion of the MPO's STBGDA funds to create a pool of funds for regional bicycle and pedestrian projects, which amounts to just over \$1M annually. Since adoption of the current policy, a significant portion of these funds have gone to Old Durham-Chapel Hill Road for construction of bicycle lanes and sidewalks from Garrett Road in Durham to Fordham Boulevard in Chapel Hill (EB-4707 A & B).

The Durham portion of this project is already under construction, and the Chapel Hill portion is set to go to bid for construction later this year. Conversations earlier this year with NCDOT revealed a significant funding gap for completion of the project. LPA staff, in consultation with local government staff, recommends programming the entirety of the Regional Bicycle and Pedestrian fund, \$2.073M, to this project. This funding, in conjunction with additional CMAQ dollars, will expedite completion of the project, and will also allow for the MPO's TAP-DA appropriation to be obligated before the federal rescission deadline of September 30, 2019. The specifics of the amount of funds for each project is shown in the attachment.

The standard TAP-DA application process is not required to program the funds because the TAP-DA funds will be applied to EB-4707 A, which was previously approved for TAP-DA funds.

TC Action: Recommended that the Board authorize the programming of Regional Bicycle and Pedestrian Funds for FY2018 and FY2019 to EB-4707 A & B, Old Durham-Chapel Hill Road.

16. Amendment #6 to the FY2018-2027 TIP (5 minutes)

17. Amendment #7 to the FY2018-2027 TIP (5 minutes)

Amendment #7 to the FY2018-2027 TIP consists of three bike/ped projects, each of which are proposed to receive additional funding to address cost increases:

- C-5179, North Estes Drive
- EB-4707A, Old Durham Road
- EB-4707B, Old Chapel Hill Road

C-5179 is receiving additional CMAQ funding, EB-4707A is receiving a combination of TAP-DA and STBGDA funding from the regional bike/ped set aside, and EB-4707B is receiving CMAQ funding as well as STBGDA funds from the regional bike/ped set aside. This amendment to the TIP programs the entirety of the regional bike/ped set aside for FY18 and FY19.

All three projects are proposed to receive over \$1M through this amendment. Per the DCHC MPO Public Involvement Policy, all three projects will have a 21-day public comment period for this amendment.

Chair Damon Seils called the meeting to order at 9:04 a.m. A roll call was performed. The Voting Members and Alternate Voting Members of the DCHC MPO Board were identified and are indicated above. Chair Damon Seils reminded everyone to sign-in using the sign-in sheet that was being circulated.

Aaron Cain discussed MPO staff developing a rescission strategy. Aaron Cain added that he will add it to

80 81 82	8. NC 98 Corridor Study Andy Henry, MPO Staff
83	Andy Henry stated that the MPO Board released the draft report of the NC 98 Corridor Study for
84	a minimum 30-day public comment period on August 8. Andy Henry reported that some MPO Board
85	members at the August MPO Board Meeting were concerned that the public involvement was not
86	sufficiently long, therefore the TC recommended extending the final date for the comment period from
87	September 6 to the proposed September 19. Andy Henry added that the approval of the final NC 98
88	Corridor Study report is scheduled to occur at the MPO Board meeting on October 8. Andy Henry added
89	that the Durham Board of County Commissioners asked to be given a resolution for the multiuse path
90	option for the Durham section of NC 98. Chair Damon Seils opened a public hearing for the NC 98
91	Corridor study. There was no comment from the public. Chair Damon Seils closed the public hearing.
92	Michael Parker made a motion to extend the public comment period to September 19 and final
93	MPO Board approval to the October MPO Board meeting. Ellen Reckhow seconded the motion. The
94	motion passed unanimously.
95 96	9. Air Quality Conformity Determination Report Andy Henry, MPO Staff

Andy Henry stated that the ruling in a recent court case made it necessary that the MPO continue to complete the Air Quality Conformity Determination Report (AQ-CDR) to demonstrate that the area's transportation sector continues to be designated as "in attainment." Andy Henry continued that the AQ-CDR was drafted, and the emissions information is projected to be completed by early October. Andy Henry stated the TC recommended that the MPO Board grant authorization to staff to release the draft AQ-CDR at the time of completion. Andy Henry also added that the AQ-CDR is a Regional document, and Capitol Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (CAMPO) and Burlington-Graham Metropolitan Planning Organization (BG MPO) will also approve the document.

Ellen Reckhow made a motion to authorize staff to release the AQ-CDR for a minimum 30-day public comment period as soon as the report is ready. Vernetta Alston seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

10. 2045 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) -- Amendment #1 Andy Henry, LPA Staff

Andy Henry stated that federal and state oversight agencies reviewed the 2045 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) and the FY2018-27 State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) and found inconsistencies between the two documents, which resulted in the need to amend the 2045 MTP so that it matched the information found in the FY2018-2027 STIP. Andy Henry added that the changes are minor, and the projects therein were not modified or altered.

Andy Henry stated that the required 30-day public comment period, which would be scheduled to end on the October 16. Andy Henry also mentioned conducting a public hearing at the next MPO Board Meeting on October 10, and the MPO Board would adopt the Amendment #1 at the following MPO Board Meeting on November 14.

Michael Parker made a motion to review Amendment #1 to the 2045 MTP, provide comments, and release Amendment #1 for a minimums 30-day public comment period. Vice Chair Wendy Jacobs seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

11. Release of Final Scores for Regional Impact Projects Aaron Cain, LPA Staff

Aaron Cain stated that NCDOT released the final scores for Regional Impact projects for Strategic Planning Office of Transportation (SPOT) 5. Aaron Cain related that the final score is comprised from 70% of the NCDOT's quantitative score; 15% from the DCHC MPO points; and 15% comes from Division points. Aaron Cain continued that the DCHC projects that scored well enough to be funded are: the Durham-Orange Light Rail (D-O LRT) project; NC 55 third southbound lane and bike/ped improvements from Meridian Parkway to I-40; and US 15-501 from the NC 54 interchange to Ephesus Church Road. Aaron Cain added that none of the three projects are programmed for the first five years of the STIP, so they must be scored again in SPOT 6. Aaron Cain also mentioned that \$190M was designated for D-O LRT in total, \$154 from Division 5 and \$36M from Division 7.

There was discussion about the prioritization of the D-O LRT project. Aaron Cain stated that there were already many projects in the first five years of SPOT 5, and that it would be necessary to move one of those projects back in order to move D-O LRT forward in priority. Chair Damon Seils and Aaron Cain agreed that MPO and DOT staff should convene and make their recommendations about which committed project would move toward the latter part of the SPOT 5.

Michael Parker stated that the required work on other projects might make the impacts on 15-501 worse without any further improvements. Aaron Cain responded that the impacts of 15-501 could be mitigated by future projects, and he planned to discuss this issue with NCDOT.

Aaron Cain listed the five projects that are in the current STIP, but upon rescoring will not be in the FY2020-2029 STIP: (1) P-5716, Grade separation of NCRR at West Ellis Drive in Durham; (2) P-5728, Grade separation of NCRR at Neal Road in Durham; (3) U-5720 C&D, US 70 from South Miami to Alexander Drive in Durham and Wake counties; (4) U5774 H, NC 54 from NC 751 to Fayetteville Road in Durham; and (5) U-6071, NC 54/Old Fayetteville Road intersection in Carrboro. Aaron Cain mentioned that (1) P-5716 was the second highest scoring non-highway project in the state at the Regional level,

but will need to be resubmitted. Aaron Cain continued that (2) P-5728 did not score well at neither the Division nor the Regional tier. Aaron Cain added that (3) U-5720 C&D was the highest scoring highway project in the state that did not get funding and will remain a sibling project, and he added that this project could be submitted as a Build NC candidate. Aaron Cain stated that (4) U-5774 H did not score well. Aaron Cain stated that (5) U-6071 would score well at the Division level, and could stay in the STIP at that tier.

Charlie Reese asked if the projects that did not rescore well were a result of a policy change that needed to be addressed or corrected by the MPO Board. Aaron Cain responded that the scoring rubric changes for each quantitative score in the respective SPOT cycle.

There was no action required by the MPO Board.

12. Allocation of Local Input Points for Division Needs Projects Aaron Cain, LPA Staff

Aaron Cain stated that on August 8, 2018, the DCHC MPO Board approved the release of the Initial Allocation of Local Input Points for Division Needs Projects for SPOT 5, based on the adopted Methodology. Aaron Cain added that the public input process began on August 22. Aaron Cain stated that the TC has provided an initial set of recommendations for allocation of Local input points for Division Needs projects per the MPO Board's request.

Aaron Cain stated that the recommendations are based on staff analysis and discussions at the August 22 TC subcommittee meeting. Aaron Cain added that there is a possibility for the initial recommendations to change. Aaron Cain stated that staff and the TC have more information of funding possibilities at the Division Needs level because the scores from the Regional Impact scoring process have recently been released. Aaron Cain added that he will continue to work with neighboring MPOs to allocate points to maximize viability. Aaron Cain continued that LPA staff will continue to work with NCDOT to get the most up-to-date data on funding availability at the Division level.

Aaron Cain stated that a TC subcommittee meeting will be held to finalize the recommendation to the TC and the MPO Board. Aaron Cain added that the MPO Board is not scheduled to take action on Division points until its meeting on October 10. The deadline for submittal of local input points for Division Needs projects is November 2. Aaron Cain requested that the MPO Board allow staff to alter the points allocation pending the release of point allocation list by the neighboring MPOs and pending approval by the MPO Chair Damon Seils and Vice Chair Wendy Jacobs.

Ellen Reckhow asked about the location of the Sandy Creek Trail project. Ellen Beckmann responded that it would go north from Pickett Road, run parallel to Cornwallis Road, and finish to the east of the Al Buehler trail. Ellen Beckmann added that it is a priority of the Durham Department of Parks and Recreation.

Charlie Reese asked about the American Tobacco Trail Tunnel project. Ellen Beckmann responded that it will be a trail that links the Belt Line to the American Tobacco Trail, but the conceptual design will likely be altered originating from design changes in the D-O LRT.

Vice Chair Wendy Jacobs raised concern about how certain projects would relate to the D-O LRT project. Vice Chair Wendy Jacobs asked how bicycle and pedestrian facilities and multiuse trails were considered. Aaron Cain and Tina Moon answered that the determining factors included cost, engineering, scoring, and available right-of-way.

Ellen Reckhow asked if there was any developer participation on the intersection at Hillandale Road and Horton Road. Bill Judge responded that the developer was unwilling to assist with the proposed roundabout, but the developer was required to perform a traffic impact analysis. Ellen Reckhow also addressed the issue of safety and unsightliness of recently completed roundabouts. Ellen Reckhow, Bill Judge, and Richard Hancock discussed adding landscaping to the center of the roundabouts in order to make the islands more visible and eliminate public eyesores.

13. Triangle Regional Freight Plan Andy Henry, LPA Staff

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Andy Henry stated that, in 2015, the DCHC MPO, CAMPO, and NCDOT partnered to hire a consultant, WSP, to complete the first freight plan for the Triangle. Andy Henry added that the study team provided updates to the TC and MPO Board, and the draft Triangle Regional Freight Plan report is now completed. Andy Henry continued that the purpose of the Freight Plan was to determine policy and investment, and it would be based on the 2045 MTP goals. Andy Henry stated that there was a regional freight advisory committee that met several times during the Freight Plan survey. Andy Henry stated that current freight inventory and trends were examined. Andy Henry stated that the freight industry wanted to avoid low bridges.

Andy Henry stated that the freight plan identified 24 project recommendations at a total cost of \$2.2B. Andy Henry also added that most of these projects are already listed in the 2045 MTP, CTP, or Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). Andy Henry also added that grade crossings and the support of GoTriangle passenger rail would benefit the freight industry.

Andy Henry stated that there were many freight-intensive industries in the Triangle, including; retail, manufacturing, construction and wholesale. Andy Henry added that one-third of the gross regional product in North Carolina is related to freight. Andy Henry indicated the key freight cluster areas. Andy Henry stated that the freight industry requested to have facilities closer to where they are needed. Andy Henry addressed another recommendation which is to adopt roadway design standards that are more adequate for heavy truck traffic. Andy Henry concluded that the approval of the Freight Plan means that the MPO Board will consider including the Plan's recommendations in the MPO's long-range transportation plans and policies.

Chair Damon Seils and Andy Henry discussed that the Rail Division of the NCDOT was involved in this project. Mark Marcoplos asked about future economic development areas. Andy Henry replied that a land use model was used, which was incorporated by the consultant. Vice Chair Wendy Jacobs asked about how future technology would be incorporated into the Freight Plan. Andy

Henry stated that self-driving vehicles were not included in this plan, however, electronic variable message signs were mentioned. Vice Chair Wendy Jacobs and Andy Henry discussed safety elements in the Freight Plan. Ellen Reckhow asked about the rate of growth of freight in the Triangle. Andy Henry responded that he did not have the growth rate, but home delivery and technology were the two biggest areas for growth. Jenn Weaver asked about the pipeline's effect on the Freight Plan. Michael Parker asked about issues of natural disaster resiliency in the Freight Plan. Chair Damon Seils and Andy Henry discussed the planning aspects around the same corridors used for light rail and freight rail, especially in Downtown Durham. Andy Henry stated that the Freight Plan does not address cross section issues, but it does address grade crossings and crossing improvements.

Michael Parker made a motion to release the draft Triangle Regional Freight Plan for public comment. Vice Chair Wendy Jacobs seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

14. Comprehensive Transportation Plan (CTP) Amendment #1 Andy Henry, LPA Staff

Andy Henry stated that, at their May meeting, the MPO Board released an amendment to the CTP to change the proposed future configuration of the portion of Farrington Road between Southwest Durham Drive and the Falconbridge Road Extension from a four-lane divided to a two-lane cross-section. Andy Henry stated that the MPO Board conducted a public hearing at their June meeting and the TC supported the designation of a two-lane divided cross-section with bicycle and pedestrian facilities. Andy Henry continued that the two-lane divided cross section would provide greater vehicle capacity than a simple two-lane section and can be built within a less intrusive 80-foot right-of-way.

Andy Henry added that a meeting was conducted with a local resident who proposed keeping the planned four-lane divided roadway. Andy Henry continued that staff recommendation remains to call for the two-lane divided cross-section because the Farrington Road along with Southwest Durham Drive will provide adequate vehicle capacity and the two-lane sections are more appropriate for the adjacent neighborhoods. Andy Henry continued that both of the roadways would provide 36K in total

capacity, which would be more than the projected 31K daily trips. Michael Parker and Andy Henry discussed the feasibility of Southwest Durham Drive being able to attract drivers away from Farrington Drive.

Andy Henry stated that the Regional Operation Maintenance Facility (ROMF) for the D-O LRT is between I-40 and Farrington Road. Vice Chair Wendy Jacobs and Andy Henry discussed that the decision to choose between a multiuse pathway or a sidewalk and bike lanes will be decided when funding is identified. Ellen Reckhow and Andy Henry discussed the roads associated with the Park and Ride station that would need to be built by GoTriangle.

Phil Post, a Durham resident and representative of a nearby homeowners association, spoke about his concerns in making the section of Farrington Road into a two-lane cross section. Phil Post stated that the projections of future traffic were not consistent with the rate of development he had witnessed in the area. Phil Post also stated that there were concerns over this roadways section and diminished the right-of-way and ability to be considered a complete street. Phil Post also discussed the need to better plan for the future development of this roadway.

Geoff Green stated that the design was limited by right-of-way constraints due to the D-O LRT tracks and the ROMF. Geoff Green also stated that the nearby residents of the proposed ROMF preferred to maintain the character of the neighborhood by making it as hidden as possible. Geoff Green continued that the right-of-way constraints included the flexibility to add an additional lane to I-40 if needed. Geoff Green added that having two two-lane roadways for drivers to choose from would increase resiliency of the traffic grid. Geoff Green confirmed that the traffic projections were not near what Phil Post mentioned in his statements.

Ellen Reckhow restated her commitment to a two-lane divided roadway, also due to the possibility of the bicycle and pedestrian facilities being more used along a two-lane divided roadway.

Vice Chair Wendy Jacobs also reiterated her support for a two-lane divided roadway from a multimodal

perspective in order to elicit bicycle and pedestrian use. Phil Post asked about the likelihood of Southwest Durham Drive being built. Andy Henry responded that there is a plan to get both roads funded. Vice Chair Wendy Jacobs and Ellen Reckhow discussed funding options for both roadways.

Ellen Reckhow made a motion to adopt Amendment #1 to the CTP. Vice Chair Wendy Jacobs seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

15. Update of the Coordinated Public Transit-Human Services Transportation Plan (CTP)

279 Meg Scully, LPA Staff

Robert Jahn, LPA Intern

Meg Scully stated that DCHC MPO is the Designated Recipient for federal funding through the Section 5310 - Enhanced Mobility of Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities Program, and receives under \$250K per year to be distributed among eligible sub-recipients. Meg Scully continued that transit law requires that projects funded through this program be derived from a locally developed, coordinated public transit-human services transportation plan (CTP) that must be updated every five years. Meg Scully added that current CTP for the DCHC MPO region was approved by the MPO Board in January, 2014, and LPA staff is now in the process of preparing an updated plan. Meg Scully stated that development of a CTP must involve seniors, individuals with disabilities, representatives of transportation and human services providers, and other members of the public. Meg Scully described that the CTP elements include: an assessment of available services; an assessment of transportation needs; strategies or projects to address the gaps in service; and priorities for implementation based on resources available.

Meg Scully stated that, in order to identify needs and prioritize projects, two workshops will be held in the MPO region: September 18 at the Chapel Hill Seymour Center and September 20 at the Durham County Cooperative Extension. Meg Scully concluded that the workshops will be followed by development of the final plan and approval by the MPO Board.

There was no action required by the MPO Board.

16. Authorize Durham city Manager on behalf of DCHC MPO to enter into agreement with North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) for Metropolitan Planning Program Grant (Section 5303)

Meg Scully, LPA Staff

Meg Scully stated that the Metropolitan Planning Program Grant, Section 5303, scope and budget for FY19 were approved by the MPO Board as part of the FY19 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) on February 14, 2018. The Durham City Manager, on behalf of the DCHC MPO, is the contractor's authorized representative for the agreement between NCDOT and then City of Durham. Meg Scully added that the MPO must authorize the City Manager to enter into agreement with the NCDOT.

Michael Parker made a motion to authorize the Durham City Manager to enter into agreement with NCDOT. Vernetta Alston seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

16a. Enhanced Mobility of Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities (Section 5310) Grant - FFY17 and FFY18 Program of Projects Meg Scully, LPA Staff

Meg Scully stated that The Enhanced Mobility of Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities program (Section 5310) provides funds to improve mobility for seniors and individuals with disabilities by removing barriers to transportation service and expanding transportation mobility options. Meg Scully continued that DCHC MPO is the Designated Recipient of the funds for the Durham Urbanized Area (UZA) and distributes the funds to eligible sub-recipients through a competitive selection process every other year. Meg Scully stated that applications for funding were reviewed by a subcommittee, and the recommended Program of Projects (PoP) is attached. Meg Scully stated the selected projects were; Chapel Hill EZ Rider Senior Shuttle, GoDurham Access, Durham County Access, and Orange County Mobility Management program. Meg Scully added that the cost savings from the DCHC MPO administrative costs for this year will allow for a new project with Chapel Hill Transit. Meg Scully concluded that LPA staff will begin the grant application process once the PoP is approved by the MPO Board.

328 Karen Howard made a motion to approve the proposed PoP. Michael Parker seconded the 329 motion. The motion passed unanimously. 17. Amendment #5 to the FY2018-2027 TIP 330 331 **Aaron Cain, LPA Staff** 332 333 Aaron Cain stated that Amendment #5 adds to the FY2018-2027 TIP various projects from the 5310 program in FY19. 334 Ellen Reckhow made a motion to approve Amendment #5 to the FY2018-2017 TIP. Vice Chair 335 336 Wendy Jacobs seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously. 337 **REPORTS:** 338 17. Report from the Board Chair 339 Damon Seils, Board Chair 340 Chair Damon Seils announced that the next Joint MPO Board meeting will be on October 31, at 9a.m. at RTP Headquarters. Chair Damon Seils added that the agenda will focus on policy. Chair Damon 341 342 Seils also added that he will not be able to attend the meeting, and Vice Chair Wendy Jacobs will lead the meeting for the DCHC MPO. 343 344 18. Report from the Technical Committee Chair Ellen Beckmann, TC Chair 345 346 Ellen Beckmann discussed a recent article that was circulated regarding states' loss of Transportation Alternatives Programs (TAP) funds. Ellen Beckmann stated that the MPO is in the process 347 348 of obligating \$7.6M worth of TAP funding for the Durham Beltway project, which will decrease the amount of federal rescission for North Carolina. Ellen Reckhow added that the amount of time between 349 350 award and expenditure has been shortened, therefore it is important to quickly obligate TAP funding. 351 19. Report from LPA Staff 352 Felix Nwoko, LPA Manager Meg Scully stated that the Annual Report for FY2018 is now on the MPO website at 353 www.DCHCMPO.org. Geoff Green discussed the schedule for public outreach for the short term plans 354

of GoTriangle, Chapel Hill Transit, and Orange Public Transit. Geoff Green discussed that the public outreach schedule could be impacted by Hurricane Florence, and GoTriangle is implementing different strategies to increase public turnout.

20. NCDOT Report

Richard Hancock, NCDOT Division 5, stated that the comment period for the Division tier input points is from October 3-16. Richard Hancock stated that Division 5 also released Regional input points. Richard Hancock stated that the Old Chapel Hill Road project is scheduled to be completed in May 2019. Richard Hancock stated that currently pedestrian fence is being installed along I-40. Richard Hancock also stated that concrete is ready to be poured on the northbound lands on the East End Connector project. Richard Hancock also stated that the ramp on I-70 westbound to NC 98 is scheduled to reopen. Lydia Lavelle and Richard Hancock discussed that there was a fabrication issue with the girders on the bridge for the Cornwallis Road Project, and it is scheduled to be open within the next few weeks. Ellen Beckmann and Richard Hancock discussed the Roxboro Road / Latta Road / Infinity Road project. Richard Hancock shared that the design alternatives are ongoing and a final determination is planned to be made within the following weeks.

Patrick Wilson, NCDOT Division 7, stated that there will be a public drop-in period for comment on the Division level point allocation from September 24-28. Patrick Wilson also commented that the roundabout in Carrboro at Estes Road and North Greensboro Street will need to be rebid for a third time, which will also require analysis from contractors to determine the reason for the relatively high bids. Patrick Wilson also stated that the roundabout at West Franklin Street and Merritt Mill Road is currently in the plan finalization stage, and is planned to be under contract by October 2018. Patrick Wilson also stated that the project is planned to be completed before fall 2019. Patrick Wilson also stated that he plans to discuss recent developments with the Town of Carrboro officials and staff.

378 Bryan Kluchar, Division 8 stated that the public comment period for Period 5 is between 379 September 24 and October 5. Julie Bogle, NCDOT Transportation Planning Division (TPD), stated that the TPD recently 380 receive the full notice to proceed with the Statewide Plan. Julie Bogle also mentioned that the 381 strategic transportation corridor studies recently temporarily worked across the development to 382 383 reevaluate the scope. 384 There was no report from NCDOT Traffic Operations. 385 **INFORMATIONAL ITEMS:** 21. Recent News, Articles, and Updates 386 No informational items were discussed. 387 388 **ADJOURNMENT:** There being no further business before the DCHC MPO Board, the meeting was adjourned at 389 11:12 a.m. 390

DURHAM COUNTY RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF A SEPARATED MULTI-USE PATH ALONG NC 98 IN DURHAM COUNTY

- **WHEREAS,** the Durham-Chapel Hill-Carrboro Metropolitan Planning Organization, along with partner municipalities, have actively worked to develop a Comprehensive Transportation Plan for the Durham-Chapel Hill-Carrboro MPO; and
- **WHEREAS,** the MPO and the North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) are directed by North Carolina General Statutes 136-66.2 to reach agreement for a transportation system that will serve present and anticipated travel demand in the MPO; and
- **WHEREAS,** it is recognized that the proper movement and variety of transportation modes within and through the MPO planning area are a highly desirable element of the plan for the orderly growth and development of the MPO; and
- **WHEREAS,** it is recognized that elements of the Comprehensive Transportation Plan involve coordination with other MPOs in the state for regional transportation projects, such as the North Carolina (NC) 98 Corridor; and
- **WHEREAS,** after full study of the NC 98 Corridor, the supporting documents presented to the public, and following a public input process that included multiple stakeholder and public workshops, several pop-up events, social media engagement, and a public hearing, the MPO Board feels it to be in the best interest of the MPO to emphasize any regional transportation corridors or projects which are pursuant to General Statutes 136-66.2; and
- **WHEREAS,** the NC 98 Corridor Plan, recommends either sidewalks and bicycle lanes or a multi-use path along the portion of the corridor within Durham County, as alternative or coexisting options, to connect nearby neighborhoods, to be designed with user safety in mind, for all ages and users, and to encourage the use of the corridor for active transportation; and
- **WHEREAS,** many public schools, neighborhood retail, a County library, and other community attractions fall along this corridor within the County and carry with them a significant amount of foot traffic; and
- **WHEREAS**, both of the MPO's long-range plans, the 2045 Comprehensive Transportation Plan and the 2045 Metropolitan Transportation Plan, have identified the NC 98 Corridor as a location for bicycle and pedestrian facilities; and
- WHEREAS, the MPO and NCDOT both have initiatives to develop transportation security and safety plans to improve transit, pedestrian, bicyclist, and highway safety in the DCHC MPO planning area, including development of Complete Streets projects and participation in Vision Zero Durham, Safe Routes to Schools, and other pedestrian safety programs; and

WHEREAS, Goal 3 of Durham County's Strategic Plan states that the County wants to "partner with stakeholders to prevent and address unsafe conditions, protect life and property, respond to emergencies and ensure accessible and fair justice", that addressing safety in transportation projects would fall into this domain, and that there would be an inherent desire to provide the safest forms of non-motorized transportation options for families and children through this corridor;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Durham County Board of Commissioners supports approval of the NC 98 Corridor Report subject to the following provisions:

- 1. That a separated multi-use path along NC 98 between US 70 and the Durham County line be constructed to provide the safest, most attractive option for moving pedestrians and bicyclists within and through the NC 98 Corridor area;
- 2. That the MPO works with NCDOT to re-allocate the funds associated with construction of separate sidewalks and bike lanes in order to build a multi-use path along the NC 98 Corridor Study.

Triangle Regional Freight Plan (Draft) DCHC MPO Board Questions

The Durham-Chapel Hill-Carrboro Metropolitan Planning Organization (DCHC MPO) released the draft Triangle Regional Freight Plan for public comment at their September meeting. At that time, several members of the MPO Board had questions about specific topics in the Freight Plan that staff were not able to answer. This document provides answers to those questions by identifying where detailed information is available in the draft report, shown in the text box, and providing a summarized answer, as well.

What is the Freight Growth Rate and Forecasts?

Table 21 and 22 on pages 84 and 85 provide a summary of Triangle freight forecasts. Detailed data on Triangle freight trends in terms of tonnage, value, mode and commodity can be found in Chapter 5, Existing Trends and Conditions, page 71. Forecasts begin on page 83.

<u>Summary</u>

In terms of trends, the economic recession of 2008 had a different impact on different supply chains. From 2007 to 2012, freight in the Raleigh-Durham area decreased significantly especially for the truck mode. Inbound shipments also decreased considerably as consumer spending contracted from the deleveraging of household debt. However, at the same time, outbound shipments increased over this period, as the high-tech economy demonstrated resilience in the face of the broader economic downturn.

In the future, the Freight Analysis Framework (FAF) reports expected freight flows in tons and value out to 2045. Overall, tonnages to, from and within the Raleigh-Durham region are expected to increase over the following decades at an average rate of 0.82 percent per year. The truck modes is expected to see the fastest growth in tonnages, going from 54 percent mode share of inbound tonnage in 2012 to 66 percent mode share in 2045. In contrast, rail is anticipated to see slower growth over this time period, which will translate into a 10 percent loss of inbound mode share. Freight value is also expected to increase at 2.4 percent per year on average out to 2045. Truck mode share will actually decrease about 5 percent in this period because air freight is expected to increase by about five-fold, which is much faster than other modes.

How Does the Plan Address Pipelines?

Detailed data and maps on pipeline commodities, capacity and future demand can be found in Chapter 7, starting on page 159.

<u>Summary</u>

There are about 750 miles of pipelines running through all nine counties in the Triangle Region. These pipelines carry three major commodity types: natural gas (65% of the total), non-highly volatile liquid (HVL) petroleum products (32% of the total) such as gasoline, and liquefied petroleum gas. The largest pipeline operator by mileage is Public Service Company of North Carolina (known as PSNC Energy), comprising 38 percent of total mileage and carrying exclusively natural gas through every county in the area. Colonial Pipeline is another major operator, comprising 32 percent of total mileage for non-HVL products only. The pipelines are commonly connected to breakout tanks for petroleum products and other facilities that often allow transfer to trucks and rail.

Future pipeline demand data is limited but it is expected to at least grow with the increasing population and commerce. The only pending pipeline project in North Carolina is the Atlantic Coast Pipeline (ACP) project, which will traverse Johnston County. The construction of the ACP suggests that natural gas capacity is limited in the Triangle Region, as well as in other parts of North Carolina.

How Does the Plan Address Roadway Resilience (for example, roads lasting longer)?

Not applicable.

Summary

The freight plan does not collect and analyze data, and does not have any recommendations that directly relate to the resiliency of roadways and freight travel. The plan focused on the topics and concerns identified through the surveys and stakeholder interviews. The resiliency of roadways in terms of pavement condition and how often the road needs repairs was not identified as a key concern. However, the importance of resiliency to disruptions such as severe weather events is pointed out as an aspect of system reliability and redundancy (pages 67-68), and a test of the resiliency of the system to highway network disruptions appears on page 140. This used a modeled evaluation of closures on I-40, and showed traffic being pushed onto local roads.

How Does the Plan Address Other Users in the Rail Corridors?

The Plan focuses on rail freight in several separate sections that address topics such as the existing network, freight forecasts, future conditions, intermodal connections and recommendations. The recommendations section, which starts on page 251, provides the most information on other users of the freight corridor such as passenger rail and roadway vehicles.

<u>Summary</u>

The Freight Plan addresses other users of the rail corridor in several ways. The passenger rail program in the Triangle, which is estimated to operate up to 44 new trains daily over the North

Carolina Railroad right-of-way, will be transformative. Freight shippers support the passenger rail program because it diverts freight movement from the congested roadways to the rails, and the transit agencies are dedicated to avoiding the impedance of freight shipping on the rail lines by making needed capacity and safety improvements.

Improvements at railway-roadway at-grade crossing is another way in which rail freight and roadway vehicle have a similar interest and therefore must coordinate and cooperate. These crossing improvements produce greater safety and efficiency for many travel modes, including truck and rail freight. The Freight Plan recommends ten key crossing improvements.

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Supplemental Information: Old Chapel Hill Road Bike/Ped (EB-4707B)

Background

The Durham-Chapel Hill-Carrboro Metropolitan Planning Organization (DCHC MPO) proposes to program \$1,710,393 of DCHC-directed CMAQ funds to a current project, EB-4707B, Old Chapel Hill Road Bike-Ped in Durham County. This project is installing bicycle lanes and sidewalks on both sides of Old Chapel Hill Road in Durham from Garrett Road to Pope Road (see attached map). The is one portion of a larger project; EB-4707A, Old Durham Road Bike-Ped, is a Chapel Hill project that will use TAP-DA and STBGDA funding to install bicycle lanes on Old Chapel Hill Road from Pope Road in Durham County to US 15/501 in Orange County. EB-4707A is scheduled to be bid for construction in Fall 2018.

This project has been in development for over a decade. The Durham portion went to construction in 2017, and significant cost increases have required additional funding to complete the project.

Project Details


The entire project, including both EB-4707A and EB-4707B, will provide sidewalks and bike lanes on both sides for 2.7 miles of Old Durham-Chapel Hill Road. An 8-foot asphalt multi-use path will be constructed in front of the State Employee's Credit Union property and a 10-foot multi-use path will be constructed in front of Githens Middle School rather than a sidewalk. The project also includes the construction of a roundabout at the intersection with Pope Road. The existing road did not have curb and gutter, so that needed to be installed as well and several overhead and underground utilities have to be moved. Other project details are shown on the attached map. This project has a definable air quality benefit, as shown in the attached calculations.

Purpose and Need

This facility will provide an excellent bike commuting route as it parallels US 15/501, which is a multi-lane facility that is not suited for bike commuters. In Durham the project improves access to Githens Middle School, Chapel Hill Road Park, and the Patterson Place mixed use development area. In Chapel Hill it improves access to the new State Employees Credit Union building (formerly Blue Cross Blue Sheild), as well as several shopping opportunities including a new Wegmans grocery store. There are also several residential neighborhoods along the route that can use the facilities to access shopping and employment opportunities.

Funding Availability

These CMAQ funds have come available due to a restructuring of CMAQ projects in the DCHC jurisdiction. The attached spreadsheet shows the currently funded projects that will now receive funding in FY20 or FY21, allowing FY18 and FY19 funding to be assigned to EB-4707B, as well as other projects. The projects now receiving FY18 and FY19 funding will be able to obligate all funds by September 2019. For purposes of the STIP, all of the funding for this project will be assigned to FY19.

As more scooters hit the streets in Raleigh, Durham still debating what to do about them

Raleigh got its second electric scooter company in downtown this week, while Durham kicked its scooter can down the road.

The Durham City Council postponed a vote on a proposed scooter ordinance for the city, even though scooters could still show up on Durham streets anyway.

The Raleigh City Council is still working on its own scooter ordinance, but already has two scooter companies operating in the city. On Wednesday, scooters from Bird, which have been in the city for weeks, were joined by scooters from Lime. That's the same company behind LimeBikes in the city.

Green LimeBikes are all over downtown Durham, too, but neither the Lime nor Bird scooters have yet to appear in the city.

Lime scooters debuted on the N.C. State University campus in Raleigh on Wednesday morning and made their way downtown by evening.

Kevin Ernest and Luke Netto took them for a ride.

"I like them better than Bird ones right now," Ernest said, pointing out that Lime has a speedometer. Ernest already had the Lime app on his phone from riding the scooters in Austin, Texas.

"This has a better bell [than Bird]," Netto added, ringing the bell on his Lime scooter.

Both men were in Raleigh for work, and they rode the scooters to dinner downtown.

"It's a little easier than Lyft or Uber," Netto said.

"And fun," Ernest said.

The Durham City Council talked about its proposed scooter ordinance — which it refers to as a "shared active transportation ordinance" — briefly at its meeting Monday. But it decided to wait until council members had more input from the Durham Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Commission, as well as what the Durham Police Department says about enforcement.

The city's interpretation of state law classifies the scooters as mopeds, which would require lights and a rearview mirror. Bird and Lime scooters on the streets in Raleigh have lights, but no license plate or mirror. And while helmets are suggested by the companies to ride scooters, most people do not.

Durham City Council member Charlie Reece asked for the delay in the scooter ordinance this week after riding a Bird scooter in Raleigh earlier this month. Reece described the electric scooters as "fun and terrifying in equal measure."

"Where there are bike lanes, these devices are amazing, but where there are no bikes lanes, they seem much less safe than bicycles because it appears that the drivers of cars and trucks have a harder time seeing these scooters," Reece wrote in an email to Durham leaders.

He said he missed having a rearview mirror and that while he wore a helmet, "nearly every other motorized scooter I saw in Raleigh was ridden on the sidewalk by someone who was not wearing a helmet."

Durham Mayor Steve Schewel responded to Reece in an email that he hopes they can figure out a way to regulate the scooters in a way that makes sense and goes along with state law.

"I do have concerns that the scooters will simply show up and get dumped on us unregulated," Schewel wrote. "This worries me for the safety of the users as well as for the inconvenience they could cause."

Although scooters did show up on Raleigh streets before the city passed regulations, no scooters are in Durham yet.

In Chapel Hill, Bird scooters descended on the UNC campus briefly as part of a "university pop-up tour", The News & Observer reported in August. But then they were quickly picked up again by Bird as the university considers a partnership with the scooter company.

A representative from Bird scooters, Servando Esparza, came to the Durham council meeting this week. He asked that the draft ordinance, which calls for a \$100 fee per scooter, be reduced. Durham City Council members will discuss the scooter permitting ordinance again at a work session meeting in a few weeks.

Fred Lamar, a senior city attorney in Durham, told the council in August that "there are a number of hurdles these companies are going to have to overcome if operating on the streets."

"If not in the streets, they wouldn't necessary fall to state law on mopeds ... but in Durham, we have ordinances that do not allow motorize vehicles or bicycles on the sidewalk," Lamar said.
