81	the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

83 84 85 86 87 88	<u>6. Triangle Region ITS Strategic Deployment Plan Update</u> Felix Nwoko, LPA Staff Casey Chae, LPA Staff Felix Nwoko reminded the committee that this item was discussed at the last TC meeting		
89	and released for public comment by the MPO Board. Felix Nwoko added that no public		
90	comments have been received to date.		
91	Scott Whiteman made a motion to recommend that the MPO Board approve the Triangle		
92	Region ITS Strategic Deployment Plan. Jomar Pastorelle seconded the motion. The motion		
93	passed unanimously.		
94 95	<u>7. State of the Region Report</u> Felix Nwoko, LPA Staff		
96	Felix Nwoko informed the group that this report was presented at the last TC meeting		
97	and released for public comment by the MPO Board. Felix Nwoko added that no public		
98	comments have been received to date.		
99	There were questions about changes that were made to the report based on comments		
100	made at the last TC meeting. Felix Nwoko noted that there were no changes to the report, but		
101	staff contacted Durham County Planning to discuss further coordination, as that was the main		
102	comment received from the MPO Board. Dale McKeel and Felix Nwoko discussed possible		
103	changes to the report.		
104	Evan Tenenbaum made a motion to recommend that the MPO Board adopt the 2019		
105	State of the Region Report. Kumar Neppalli seconded the motion. The motion passed		
106	unanimously.		
107 108	<u>8. TIP Amendment #3</u> Anne Phillips, LPA Staff		

Anne Phillips shared that Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Amendment #3 was complex and mainly involved projects amended in the State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) by the NCDOT. The amendment also included projects affected by the STIP reprogramming exercise performed by NCDOT. She further noted that DCHC worked with the local planners to update project schedules for locally administered projects (LAP). These projects are also being amended, and a list was included in the agenda packet.

Based on conversations with NCDOT regarding the STIP reprogramming, there were three local project schedules adjusted in Durham: 1) Third Fork Creek Trail 2) Guess Road Sidewalks and 3) NC 55 Sidewalks. The DCHC adjusted these schedules to allow the Woodcroft Parkway Extension project to move forward so that the City of Durham would not lose already completed design work.

Anne Phillips stated that these changes require public release as defined by the MPO Public Involvements Policy (PIP), but the MPO Board may decide to release the amendment if they find the changes to be significant.

123 Vice Chair Ellen Beckmann recommended that when this item is presented to the MPO

124 Board, it should be noted that the Guess Road Sidewalks and NC 55 Sidewalks are

125 underfunded in the current TIP with both federal funds and the local match not appropriated by

the City of Durham at this point. There was also discussion about the 21-day public comment

127 period.

Vice Chair Ellen Beckmann made a motion to recommend that the MPO Board approve
TIP Amendment #3. Scott Whiteman seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

130 <u>9. NC Moves 2050 Draft Recommendations</u> 131 Julie Bogle, NCDOT

Julie Bogle provided an update on the NCDOT's long-range, multi-modal transportation
plan, NC Moves 2050. She indicated that by collaborating with subject matter experts (SMEs)
they were able to refine strategies and actions. The effort included a public interest survey

garnering approximately 15,000 responses, and the data was converted into eight different
languages. There were eight strategies developed with specific actions. The action items were
divided into three implementation tiers: 1) 10+ years 2) 20+ years and 3) 30+ years. The tiers
were based upon several factors that included timing, deployment based on NCDOT readiness,
risk level, experience and support, and partners involved.

There were 15 tier-1 actions developed that align and cover the primary five objectives.
There are six tier-2 actions and ten tier-3 actions. The public comment on these action items will
be from October 9th through November 9th.

Profile sheets have been developed and assigned to each action item to facilitate the implementation process. Each profile sheet includes information about the action based upon readiness, risks, resources, partners, and resources needed to complete these actions. A webtool will be made available to track and view the progress of the action items after the plan is adopted.

Julie Bogle stated that the plan was presented to the Board of Transportation on October 8th. Members were encouraged to visit ncmoves.gov and social media platforms to stay updated and to interact with the plan. Felix Nwoko stated that MPO staff will be collecting comments from the DCHC MPO. Chair Nish Trivedi encouraged action to collect as many public comments as possible.

153 <u>9A. Release of CTP Amendment #2 for Public Comment</u> 154 Andy Henry, LPA Staff 155

Andy Henry requested release of Comprehensive Transportation Plan (CTP) Amendment #2 for a 30-day public comment period. Andy Henry stated that what this change would entail is removing the Bridges Avenue Extension from the CTP. The primary reasons are due to the extension not having much impact on the grid, that it would impact a residential, suburban area (Hickory Nut Drive), and the projected high cost to construct a bridge over the CSX rail lines.

162 There was discussion concerning the implications of the proposed change. Key issues 163 included this being a minor amendment change and having a public comment period.

164 Vice Chair Ellen Beckmann made a motion to release the CTP Amendment #2 for a 30-

165 day comment period. Zach Hallock seconded the motion. The motion was passed unanimously.

166 **REPORTS FROM STAFF:**

167 10. REPORT from Staff

168 Felix Nwoko, LPA Staff

Aaron Cain announced that Ellen Beckmann, Vice Chair, is leaving the City of Durham

and going to work with Durham County. Aaron Cain asserted that based on the bylaws and

171 conversations with county officials, Ellen Beckmann could retain the position by being appointed

by Durham County. The TC was asked if there were any concerns with moving forward with this

173 interpretation of the bylaws. It was recommended that a statement about TC's decision be put in

174 writing for future reference and understanding about the process. John Hodges-Copple

175 recommended that the TC document how these transitions. It was agreed that, if this was noted

- 176 in the TC Minutes, this documentation would substantiate the decision for Ellen Beckmann's
- 177 transition from Durham City to Durham County.
- 178 Bergen Watterson had a question regarding the FY22 Unified Planning Work Program
- 179 (UPWP) spreadsheets and narratives that are due on Monday (November 2nd). Felix Nwoko
- 180 offered to discuss her question after the TC meeitng.

181 11. Report from the Chair

182 Nishith Trivedi, TC Chair

- 183 Chair Nishith Trivedi reported that the Board of Orange County Commissioners
- 184 approved the Research Triangle Logistics Park.

185 12. NCDOT Reports

186 Richard Hancock, Division 5-NCDOT

187 Richard Hancock stated that there was no additional report. Dale McKeel inquired about

additional information on the Alston Avenue project and reminded the TC that recent reports

state the completion date is February 2021. Richard Hancock responded that will verify the
dates and report his findings to the TC. There was also a request for an update on the Beltline
contract approval.

192 Stephen Robinson, Division 7-NCDOT

193 Stephen Robinson reported that there have not been many changes to projects, but

194 there are paved shoulders, turning lanes, and overlays on West Ten Road from Buckhorn Road

195 to Bushing Cook Road. There is a start date of November 13th, but the spending freeze has

resulted in a completion date in April 2021.

197 The additional adjustment is guardrail installation on NC 86 that has been delayed one

198 year, from October 2020 to October 2021, and the completion date was moved from April 2021

- 199 to April 2022.
- 200 Bryan Kluchar, Division 8-NCDOT

201 Bryan Kluchar indicated that updates were located on page 10 of the NCDOT Reports in

the Agenda packet. There were no additional updates.

203 Julie Bogle, Transportation Planning Division-NCDOT

- 205 There was no additional report.
- 207 John Grant, Traffic Operations-NCDOT
- 209 There was no additional report.

211 **INFORMATIONAL ITEMS:**

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Aaron Cain noted that the joint DCHC-CAMPO online virtual meeting will be held on

- 215 An inquiry was posed to Kathryn Zeringue regarding the Belt Line project and the
- 216 possibility of future funding from NCDOT if costs increased. There was a request for guidelines
- 217 or changes to policy on this matter to share with others. Kathryn Zeringue agreed to inquire
- about the policy and share with members.

Aaron Cain reminded the TC that, due to Veterans Day and the Thanksgiving holiday, meeting dates have been shifted. The MPO Board Meeting will be on November 4th and the TC meeting will be on November 18th. There was also an inquiry about the concerns discussed with the 15-501 project.
